

Chart 2: Local bus passenger journeys (seasonally adjusted) by metropolitan area status: England, quarterly from January to March 2005 to January to March 2022 -






Bus Numbers Still Down





IN MY VIEW

IT was a pleasure to meet with the Somerset Development Manager for the Federation of Small Businesses, Ruth Lambert, at the end of last week. As we look to promote sustainable growth in the economy it was a great time to hear more about some of the ambitions and concerns of our small businesses, of which the FSB represents around 350 in Yeovil and South Somerset alone.

As well as issues about the cost of energy and some materials, we discussed some things that I think the Government should consider, such as how to encourage early payments to suppliers by larger companies, enforcing the right to repair and stopping companies such as Apple frustrating it, and looking to raise the VAT registration threshold which has been the same for some years now. Many thanks to Ruth for her time.

On a related note, I am in regular contact with the Somerset Bus Partnership who are campaigning to get more people using local bus routes again as numbers are still down as compared to before the Covid pandemic. The Government has stepped in with a bus recovery grant but routes need to be sustainable. Whether it's to not worry about parking, to help the environment or to help make sure our buses are well used and popular again, do think about getting back on board next time you are making a trip.

Rishi Sunak is the new Prime Minister. I had supported Penny Mordaunt as more of a fresh start candidate and one able to unify the Party which is needed for effective government. She got within a couple of MP endorsements of making the 100 threshold to be taken to a vote of Members. I understand that no-one wanted a lengthy leadership challenge but would have liked to see some more opportunities to look at the candidates and their policies. Hopefully a better process can be agreed on for the future.

I want Rishi to succeed and do well and I hope that most of us do, as his success is very much linked to ours as a country. The challenge for him I think will be to show that he can take bold decisions to reduce the tax burden in a sustainable way and make the UK internationally competitive. We have to move on from the high taxing big spending government of the pandemic. Thank you very much to everyone who got in touch over the last few weeks with their views and preferences about leaders and the other big issues facing us at the moment.

Now that Parliament is fully restored to normal business after the pandemic there are lots of opportunities to visit and see the amazing buildings and enjoy the history of the place whatever your political views. Schools can get in touch with the brilliant education team who may even be able to help with the cost of a trip to London. There are also guided tours and a limited number of tickets available to Prime Minister's Questions. These are popular and there may be a bit of a wait but do get in touch if you are interested.




